Day Camp Administrative Assistant:

- Capture footage and organize photos for future promotional needs.
- Support programs with pre-summer video production.
- Train, coordinate, supervise, and care for the Tech Assistant.

Waterfront Team:

Gets to maintain waterfront facility and safely run the waterfront (including swimming area, water activities, and boat driving) for campers and programs throughout the summer.

- Maintain the safety and proper operation of all waterfront areas and assist campers.
- Lifeguard for a variety of activities.

Worship Leader:
