Program Positions

Program Directors:

Will develop and implement creative, age-appropriate programs for campers, and lead and supervise staff. Dates: May 23 - August 15

4 positions:

- *Day Camp*—about 85 day (8:30am-6:00pm) campers each week in 1st 7th grade. Directors have evening planning responsibilities and supervise high school-aged counselors.
- *Kishwauketoe*—about 45 overnight campers each week in 2nd 4th grade. Directors supervise college-aged counselors.
- *Pier 30*—about 200 overnight campers each week in 4th 9th grades (specific age groups rotate throughout the summer). Directors supervise college-aged counselors.

Team Counselors:

Dates: May 23 - August 15

<u>2 Positions</u>: 1 male, 1 female

Responsibilities Include:

- Disciple, train, evaluate, and keep counseling staff accountable.
- Equip staff in evangelism and small group Bible study.
- Organize daily staff devotions, prayer support network, and daily prayer coverage. May play role in leading sessions and/or musical worship.
